The School Attendance & Punctuality Policy can be found on the School Website. Email & App messages were sent out last week to parents of children with less than 90% attendance (persistent absentee category) & to those who could potentially fall into this category shortly, as well, as children who regularly arrive late. We understand that there are, in most cases, valid reasons for attendance being low & lates being high but we have to keep parents informed of the figures. Punctuality is very important. Children need to arrive by 8.40am as the gates will be locked at 8.45am & children need to be in class at 8.45am ready to start their school day. This applies to all classes in main school including Reception class (Nursery start at 8.45am). Any children arriving after 8.45am will need to be signed in late at the school office. Breakfast Club starts at 7.45am with last entry being 8.35am. Last time for food is 8.25am. We monitor all children's attendance closely & ask for your support to ensure your child is in school as much as possible. Please let us know if there are specific reasons affecting attendance & punctuality as we may be able to help.

# **Holiday Requests**

All requests for absence must be made in writing at least 7 days in advance. We have forms available at the school office. Holiday fines (5 days & over or combined over a 10 week period) are now £80 per child rising to £160 if not paid within 21 days, if not paid the fine will go to court. For second & third episodes of absence, fines start at a higher amount or go straight to court. These are new procedures that started from September 2024 introduced by the government.
